AWARD RECIPIENTS

WEST SHORE AWARE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The scholarship program now offers \$1,000 scholarships renewable for 4 years to 2 Saugatuck High School Graduates. This program is managed through an endowment held by Allegan County Community Foundation. The scholarship board is developing a ten year plan to build the fund into a permanent scholarship endowment fund.

SAFE HARBOR CHILDREN'S ADVOCACY CENTER

Safe Harbor Children's Advocacy Center provides a lifeline to child victims of abuse and neglect in Allegan County through a variety of free programs. Through our Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) program, our CASA Director trains volunteers to speak up for children in the family court and foster care system who are victims of child abuse or neglect.

WINGS OF HOPE HOSPICE

This organization will provide hospice care for individuals that have a life expectancy of six months or less. Pain and symptom management are primary foundational goals accomplished with treatments, medications, therapeutic oxygen and other equipment. Gifts, grants, and donations enable their goal of a painless and comfortable existence for their patients in Allegan County and surrounding communities.

CHILDREN FIRST LAKESHORE

The mission of Children First Lakeshore is to feed all children in Allegan County who are in need of food without exception. The Children First Lakeshore goal is to drastically reduce the number of students in need of food by creating sustainable backpack meal programs within the schools we align with. Children First Lakeshore supports weekend backpack meal programs at Douglas and Fennville Elementary Schools. They are currently feeding approximately 170 students ranging in age from preschool to 6th grade.

WISHBONE PET RESCUE ALLIANCE

Wishbone Pet Rescue Alliance requests will assist with the medical needs of the animals that are brought to the Allegan County animal shelter. All animals that are transferred, adopted, or leave the shelter receive necessary veterinary services and spay/neuter. Just as the cost of healthcare for humans has risen, pharmaceuticals are scheduled to increase by 30% this year. All Allegan County strays and pet surrenders are managed at this shelter.

RESILIENCE: ADVOCATES FOR ENDING VIOLENCE

From emergency shelter and sexual assault forensic exams to school-based prevention programs, Resilience works at every level to advance their mission: to respond to, reduce, and prevent domestic and sexual violence. They offer high quality, confidential care at no charge, ensuring that all survivors have access to the support they need to build resilience and find a path to healing.



AWARD SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Westshore Aware Scholarship Fund was started in 2007. Since that time we now are giving \$1,000 scholarships renewable for 4 years to 2 Saugatuck High School Graduates. Through the hard work of the past board of directors of the scholarships and the board of West Shore Aware, we are working on creating an endowment so we can continue to give scholarships into perpetuity. This will remind our community of what the LGBTQ Community has done for them after we are all gone.

Lawrence Gammons, (in memory of Carl Jennings) offered to match all donations for the scholarships up to \$30,000 for every dollar you donate.
